Letter From BHSSF



During the 2020–2021 academic year, Beaverton High School (BHS), like other high schools, faced the unprecedented challenge of keeping our students, staff, and community connected during a global pandemic. Despite obstacles that included "Zoom fatigue" and ever-changing decisions and policies, BHS managed to create the best possible learning and social environment to support students as they create a path to their future.

And the Beaverton High School Success Fund (BHSSF) played a vital role in providing resources and supplies that helped make this unique year even more special. BHSSF provided additional school supplies to students, which were distributed as part of "quarterly kick-off" events at the high school. Teachers were able to acquire technology that helped them turn their homes into classrooms. The Success Fund was able to recognize the tireless efforts of the BHS staff with meaningful celebrations and expressions of gratitude to show appreciation for educating our children.

BHSSF continued to support the "after-school weight program" so students could be connected through virtual workouts as well as onsite during the last few months of the school year. We provided financial support for Actively Learn, an interactive tool that expands access for all students to literature in BHS language arts classes. Finally, we awarded \$30,000 in college scholarships for graduating seniors. All of this made a positive impact in the lives of our students and staff, even in this most difficult of academic years.

As we turn our attention to the future, the Beaverton High School Success Fund will play a key role in helping to ensure that 100% of our students are Enrolled, Employed, or Enlisted after they graduate from Beaverton High School. We remain steadfastly committed to providing as many opportunities as possible for all BHS students to enjoy their time at BHS and leave prepared for their future.

Thanks to a generous donation (see Scott Shleifer profile), the Success Fund will be a "difference maker" at another level starting with the 2021–2022 academic

year. Our goal is to ultimately make Beaverton High School a "fee-free" school. While this vision is not yet a reality, today we have become the most "fee-friendly" public high school in the district and perhaps in the state of Oregon.

We are now able to pay for every BHS student to receive an ASB (Associated Student Body) sticker which grants free or reduced admission to games, plays, and dances. Over 50 Beaverton High School clubs will receive additional financial support to enhance the experience of students who find connection with these groups. Teachers are being encouraged to incorporate immersive experiences directly into their classes through field trips, visitations, special lectures, and projects. Fees for Activities and Athletics will either be fully paid for or greatly subsidized by the Beaverton High School Success Fund. And we will be expanding our college scholarship awards to over \$150,000 annually—to be aligned not just with financial need but also in recognition of student contributions in conjunction with BHS core values—Excellence, Learning, Community Connection, and Tradition.

In summary, it is truly an amazing time to be part of the Beaverton High School community. And all these investments and innovations at BHS would not be possible without the generosity of all our donors.

Thank you for your continued support for Beaverton High School and the Beaverton High School Success Fund. Together, we look to continue in building a bright future of our students, staff, and for Beaverton High School.



"Actively Learn" software purchased for the English Department to enhance learning, feedback, analytics, and grading between the teacher and student.




Ring lights, webcams, and/or headsets to teachers who needed them for remote learning.




Morale-boosting t-shirts, coffee mugs, and signage for students and/or staff.



175 \$20 gift cards to Powells Bookstore for each educator.




Five \$5,000 scholarships to graduating seniors who demonstrated exceptional service to their community, dedication to their education, and financial need.








