WHAT WE FUND

Examples of Initiatives Funded

- **College Scholarships** awarded to both those in need and those who exemplify Beaverton High School core values
- AVID Students laptops given to all college bound graduating AVID students in the class of 2024
- **Student and Teacher Grants** funds available for both teachers and students for specific programs, field trips and equipment
- All Student Body Stickers provides free admittance for all students into all school sponsored events
- **Technology** enhancements in classrooms, including new cameras purchased for photography classes
- **Underwriting of Class, Activity and Athletic Fees** enables more students to fully participate in their school community, making BHS the most fee-friendly school in the district
- Athletic Department Funding provides for additional safety and equipment needs
- AP Test Fees covers exam fees for all students
- **Graduating Seniors** underwrites the fees and therefore reduces costs associated with cap, gown and announcement packages
- **Tradition Unites Us** all students receive a BHS class T-shirt and are invited to join the tradition of school spirit every Friday during the school year
- Student Run Literary Magazine gives a voice to student authors
- Career Pathway Enrichment includes facility and curriculum enhancements for Engineering, Health Careers, Marketing, Digital Media and Education

The BHSSF supports AVID students with cost free laptops to all graduating, college bound seniors.




Class and activity fees are underwritten by the BHSSF to encourage students to explore options and become more fully involved in their school community.


